While this worksheet is directed at the high schooled student, it's really intended to help the homeschool *teacher* plan out their child's classes and portfolio.

High School students are really becoming young adults, and are capable of a great deal of educational independence. However, *you* need to decide what evidence you'll need of their learning... before June arrives and you discover that there's nothing physical to put into a portfolio.

I've included a sample plan and a blank time log for your convenience.

Please, please plan on graduating your homeschooled student with a transcript and a diploma.
If they did the work, they should get credit for it!

Algebra I (1) credit	Course material	Complete modules A, B, C of VideoText Algebra	Include various quizzes and assignments, dated. * Include unit and/or cumulative tests
Other Worlds (1) Credit	Course material says so	Curriculum: DVD lessons, anthology, workbook	Will include a reading list of chosen selections. Include a self-published copy of completed novel!
Spanish II (1) Credit	Course material	VLACS online	Will print out each chapter exam, key writing assignments, and detailed grade listing from website.
Biology (1) Credit	Course material	Apologia biology text; CoOp experiments w/mrs smith	Completed module tests... open book! Copies of 4 key lab reports... or just toss in the book.
US Government (½ Credit)	College level test	CLEP prep book	Student will study and pass the CLEP exam for college credit. Include great study aids, plus grade from the exam.
Physical Education (½ Credit)	Time: over 65 hours!	Student will complete P90x.	Log time and activities. Include pre- and post-tests, with logs, in portfolio.
Hippology II (1 credit)	Time: over 130 hou, and level of course material	Classes at local farm, outside research for 4H competition	Time log for classes, study and projects. Research project for 4H, letter from instructor.
Early Education (1) credit	Time: over 130 hours	Sonlight Pre-K; Ruth Beechik's books; Teaching K4 to sister!	Once a week summary of what sis is learning, once a month observation by supervisor (me), and periodic sample lesson plans. Credit for sister's progress!
